

WEST GRAND CAMPAIGN FACES DEADLINE

2012 is Critical for Community-led 22,000-acre Conservation Project

With six months to go before a December 2012 deadline, and major challenge grants at stake, an additional \$2 million is needed. These funds will secure a conservation easement to be held by the Maine Department of Conservation that will guarantee 17 miles of lakeshores and 22,000 acres will never be developed and

will always be open to public recreation.

Pledges and contributions now can ensure the future of special places – from West Grand Lake and Grand Lake Stream, to Big Musquash and Big Lake, and many more. Please join the effort!

The 22,000 acres under option to DLLT that surround Grand Lake Stream, coupled

with the existing DLLT Farm Cove Community Forest, will define the future character of the village and its quality as a destination for outdoor recreation. Starting with the unanimous vote at town meeting to contribute \$40,000, the West Grand Lake Community Forest Project has quietly built momentum. It was the #1 forest conservation priority for the federal Forest Legacy Program in 2011, and has attracted over \$13 million in funding.

Success in acquiring the conservation easement will also extend our opportunity to buy the property under the option agreement. Community-focused forest management will ensure ongoing wildlife habitat improvements and a continuing timber economy.

I sincerely encourage all of you to join us at the annual picnic, where we will present a fuller progress report. And of course I hope you will do all in your power – either through financial contributions or by bringing prospective donors to our attention – to help us succeed in our determination, as the slogan goes, to preserve "Forests and Lakes, For People, Forever."

Firewood: Heating Homes & Helping Habitats

Our Community Forest approach to management is focused on wildlife habitat, public recreation, and a sustainable timber economy – and we look for opportunities to provide direct benefits to local people. This past winter, we adapted our community firewood harvest permit program to improve wildlife habitat.

Downeast Lakes Land Trust issues permits for local residents and property owners to harvest a small volume of firewood – one cord per year for seasonal residents and camp owners, and now two cords per year for year-round residents.

This winter’s harvest was focused on the former Brown farm at the east edge of the Farm Cove Community Forest. Biologist Andy Weik of the Ruffed Grouse Society helped evaluate the area, and forester John Harmon marked boundaries and trees to be saved. The land trust co-sponsored a chainsaw safety workshop with the Small Woodland Owner’s Association of Maine, and residents cut and hauled their own firewood. The habitat area will be expanded slightly this summer by contractor Tide Mill Enterprises that DLLT has also hired to create additional small blocks of early successional habitat on Daugherty Ridge, with help from the Ruffed Grouse Society. This work is expected to benefit woodcock and ruffed grouse, along with songbirds such as chestnut-sided warblers, and provide browse for deer and moose.

Wind Power Proposal Update

In May, 2011 we reported on a proposal to construct a 27 turbine wind power development that would have been visible from many of the Downeast Lakes. On April 20, 2012, Maine’s Land Use Regulatory Commission formally voted to deny the project application. The Commission cited the scenic impact of the project as the primary reason for its denial, and also noted the significance of the Downeast Lakes region as a destination for outdoor recreation that sustains a tourism based economy, with sporting camps a cultural and recreational resource worthy of protection.


