



## **The Little Mayberry Cove Trail**

runs approximately two and a half miles along the western shoreline of West Grand Lake. The trail begins at the village of Grand Lake Stream,

and follows moderately rolling terrain through mossy stands of hemlocks and pines, ending at a quiet cove. Hikers can return on the same trail, or loop back via interior logging roads.

The shoreline trail is intended for foot traffic and day-use only. Tread lightly! Please stay on the trail, and carry out any refuse you bring in. Overnight camping is not permitted. Stay alert if walking on the logging roads; these are also used by logging equipment, motor vehicles, ATVs, and mountain bikes. No parking is available at the trailhead nor along the road beyond the dam. All hikers should park in the lot on the dam's west side. Begin by walking along the camp road up the west side of the lake to trail's start. Watch for trail signs. Once on the trail, look for yellow painted blazes. The trail passes near several privately owned cottages. Please respect the privacy of the owners.






