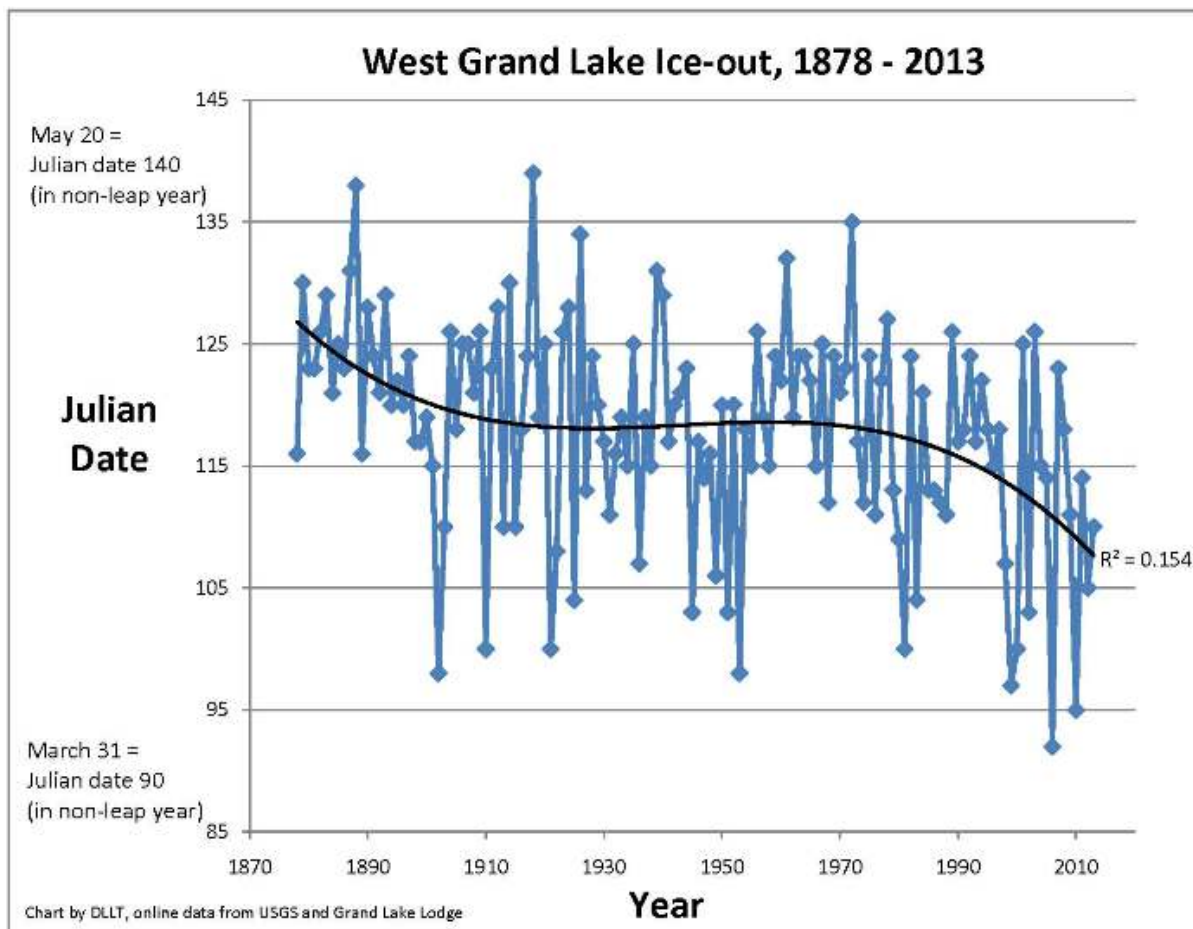

plenty of cold this winter, and some snow still on the ice to reflect the sun, ice out looks pretty far away. There's still good ice-fishing, snowshoeing, skiing, and snowmobiling now - but sun, warmth, and wind can change conditions fast.
