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### First California Forest Carbon Offsets Aid Downeast Conservation

On November 13, 2013 Downeast Lakes Land Trust announced the nation's first issuance of California Air Resources Board Offset Credits for a forestry project. Nearly 200,000 compliance offsets were issued for the Farm Cove Improved Forest Management Project in eastern Maine. The initial offsets have been contracted to two non-disclosed compliance buyers in the first sales of registered and issued forestry offsets for California's greenhouse gas cap and trade program.

Downeast Lakes Land Trust will use proceeds from the sale of Farm Cove forest carbon offsets to help finance its capital campaign to expand the Farm Cove Community Forest by purchasing the adjacent 22,000-acre West Grand Lake Forest. **[READ MORE](#)**

## GLS Fish Hatchery Tour and Salmon Milking


