



- ~All photos submitted must be shot in the Downeast Lakes region.
- ~All photo submissions must be completed electronically and in the digital format of JPEG, JPG, or GIF. All photos must also have a minimum resolution of 5 megapixels.
- ~By submitting photos, participants agree that DLLT shall have the unlimited right to reproduce submissions in any electronic and print media that it may produce in the future.

~Each submission must have an accompanying Name, Address, Phone Number, and Email Address.

Downeast Lakes Land Trust Internships (2 positions) - 2016

Community Forest Conservation: Habitat, Recreation, & Education

Downeast Lakes Land Trust is based in Grand Lake Stream, Maine. We protect lakeshores, improve fish and wildlife habitats, provide public recreation opportunities, offer educational programs, and support jobs in the forest and on the water. We are dedicated to the Downeast economy and environment.



This internship will provide broad exposure and experience assisting the work of a community-based conservation group engaged in landscape-scale forest conservation and management. The intern will assist with planning and implementing habitat restoration projects, conducting wildlife and habitat monitoring, coordinating citizen science data gathering, and performing routine maintenance of hiking trails and campsites on the Farm Cove Community Forest. The intern will also assist with DLLT events and ongoing education programs.

Qualifications: Undergraduate or graduate student in a natural resources related field, with ability to work independently, excellent communication and computer skills, and experience working outdoors. Experience with GPS/map and compass, trail camera operation, data management, trail maintenance, and wilderness medical training desirable. Personal 4-wheel drive vehicle is preferred.

Details: DLLT is seeking 2 interns for eight weeks in the summer of 2016. Start and end dates are negotiable depending on the successful candidate's academic schedule. The intern will receive a weekly stipend of \$300. Lodging is not provided, but we can assist the intern with arranging local accommodations if needed.

“Big Night” Amphibian Walk

Every year in April, countless species of amphibians welcome the arrival of spring with what’s known in naturalist circles as the “big night.” On the first warm, rainy night of spring, when temperatures hover well above the 40-degree mark, amphibians emerge from their winter hideouts in huge numbers. A mass exodus of frogs, toads, and salamanders makes the forest floor come alive, as these moisture-loving critters make their way to vernal pools to mate and lay eggs. If you have never experienced a “big night,” you are missing out on one of nature’s most unique events!

Downeast Lakes Land Trust’s Education and Outreach Manager, Colin Brown, will be leading a “Big Night Amphibian Walk” to celebrate this annual migration. Furbearers of Maine
