April 21 – Spring Break Kids Hike

During April break, Downeast Lakes Land Trust is hosting a "Signs of Spring" hike for kids in grades 3 – 8 along the newly-created Tower Hill Trail in the Downeast Lakes Community Forest. May 27 – Yacolucci Woods Birding Walk

Downeast Lakes Land Trust is pleased to sponsor the 14th Annual Downeast Spring Birding Festival with a birding walk at Yacolucci Woods. Join DLLT Education and Outreach Manager Colin Brown for an afternoon walk through Yacolucci Woods – a 100-acre parcel that is permanently conserved for wildlife habitat. An easy walking path passes through several different forest types, allowing for good

views of woodpeckers, warblers, wetland species, and many more. Be sure to bring your binoculars and water!

For festival-goers, this walk serves as an excellent stop that immediately follows the “Burn Road” program, located 15 minutes south along Route 1. Anyone planning on attending the Burn Road walk, followed by the Moosehorn evening program, can fill their afternoon with this great excursion! Yacolucci Woods is located directly along the west side of Route 1, on the Waite/Talmadge town line. Yacolucci Woods is roughly 4 miles south of the intersection of Routes 1 and 6. We will meet in the parking area along the road, next to the sign.

May 31 – DLLT Community Meeting

On Wednesday, May 31st, join DLLT Staff for a community meeting and update on what’s happening in the Downeast Lakes Community Forest. We will discuss upcoming timber harvests, wildlife management strategies, education programs, and more. This presentation will be followed by a question and answer session.
